Why does Oakley need a new library and community learning center?

In 1999, Oakley's Community Library moved to the Freedom High School campus, in what was supposed to be a temporary five-year arrangement. Seventeen years later, the Library is still there and is limited in all regards. The library space is only 3,000 square feet. The collection, technology, space, programs and parking are all lacking at this location.

How much will my taxes increase if I vote "yes"?

Voter approval of the ballot measure will result in approximately \$7.75 in additional tax, per month, per parcel for 30 years.

On June 7, 2016, the City of Oakley is asking residents to vote on a \$12 million bond to build a new downtown library and community learning center.

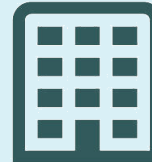
