Oakley City Council

4.1 Diablo Water District Office Building DR 01-14 (Ken Strelo, Senior Planner)

Senior Planner Ken Strelo presented the staff report, with amendments.

Councilmember Rios thanked and complimented the applicant, Mike Yeraka, General Manager for Diablo Water District, for including a drought resistant garden.

Mayor Pope requested the parking spaces not be less than 9 feet in width.

It was moved by Vice Mayor Hardcastle and seconded by Councilmember Rios to approve Item 4.1 as amended. Motion was unanimous and so ordered. (5-0)

Mr. Yeraka thanked the City Council and commented it was a pleasure to work with City staff.

6.0 REPORTS

6.1 CITY MANAGER

City Manager Bryan Montgomery mentioned the City Council and City staff met earlier today to discuss the 2014-2016 Strategic Plan. He invited everyone to attend the Community Strategic Plan meeting to be held Monday, March 10 at the Freedom High School Multi-Purpose Room at 6:30pm.

6.2 OAKLEY CITY COUNCIL/OAKLEY CITY COUNCIL ACTING AS THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY TO THE OAKLEY REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY

(a) Reports from Council Liaisons to Regional Committees, Commissions and Boards AND Oakley City Council/Oakley City Council Acting as the Successor Agency to the Oakley Redevelopment Agency Comments

Councilmember Rios announced she attended the Friends of Marsh Creek Delta Restoration Project. She mentioned the Walls that Heal exhibition, a replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall in Washington, D.C., will be on display at the California State Capitol West Steps February 27-March 2.

Councilmember Romick announced he attended the Contra Costa Transportation Authority (CCTA) meeting last Wednesday and he was elected Chair of the Contra Costa Transportation Committee for the next year. He commented that he is impressed with the work the CCTA is doing, including its completion of the Caldecott Tunnel, managing the \$1.4 billion Highway 4 widening project, and the Highway 4 to Highway 160 groundbreaking that will occur soon.

Councilmember Burgis thanked Councilmember Rios for attending the Friends of Marsh Creek Delta Restoration Project. She announced Contra Costa Flood Control will be working on their wetland restoration project on March 8 and she encouraged the public and the City Council to attend. She mentioned the next non-profit roundtable will be held March 19. She also announced she was elected to the Executive Committee of the League of California Cities East Bay Division which represents Contra Costa County and Alameda County cities. She also mentioned Science Week will begin April 5.

Vice Mayor Hardcastle mentioned he met with a group in Brentwood on February 18 to discuss an FM radio station in Oakley, possibly at Freedom High School, which should be on the air by August 2015.

Mayor Pope announced the East Contra Costa Fire Protection District meeting will be held Monday, March 3 at 6:30pm at City Hall and encouraged everyone to attend to hear what fire services may look like if more funding is not obtained. He mentioned he attended the Habitat Conservancy meeting last week at City Hall and he received comments on how beautiful the new improvements in Oakley look. He also mentioned he will attend the Ironhouse Sanitary District meeting next Tuesday and Vice Mayor Hardcastle will attend the Mayors Conference next Thursday.

(b) Requests for Future Agendas

Councilmember Burgis requested staff research the possibility of placing a dog park in Oakley.

Councilmember Romick requested staff revisit beekeeping in Oakley.

7.1 Discussion Regarding Community Garden Efforts (Councilmember Burgis)

Councilmember Burgis invited the Oakley Community Garden Task Force to provide a presentation regarding a potential community garden to be located at what is known as the "Moura property", located on O'Hara Avenue just south of O'Hara Park Middle School.

Paul Seger led a Power Point presentation regarding the community garden on behalf of the Task Force, providing information on the Task Force's goal, mission, project goal, lease proposal, fiscal sponsor and resources, benefits to the community, water access and potential site ideas. Mr. Seger explained other site options were considered; however, the Moura property offered the best location for water access, it is close to schools and trails, and it does not present potential issues with water collection and toxins as basins do.

The City Council requested the Task Force continue to explore water access with the Oakley Unified Elementary School District.

The Task Force agreed that the community garden could be relocated if it should be decided another use was more suitable for the Moura property in the future.

The City Council expressed support for the Community Garden and requested staff return to the City Council with a two-year lease for consideration, pending formation of the Task Force's 501(c)(3) entity.
