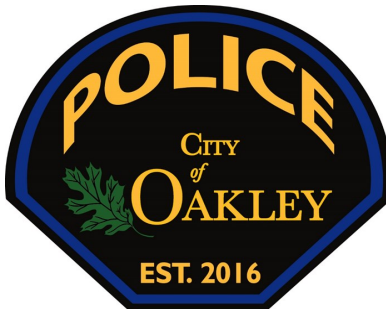
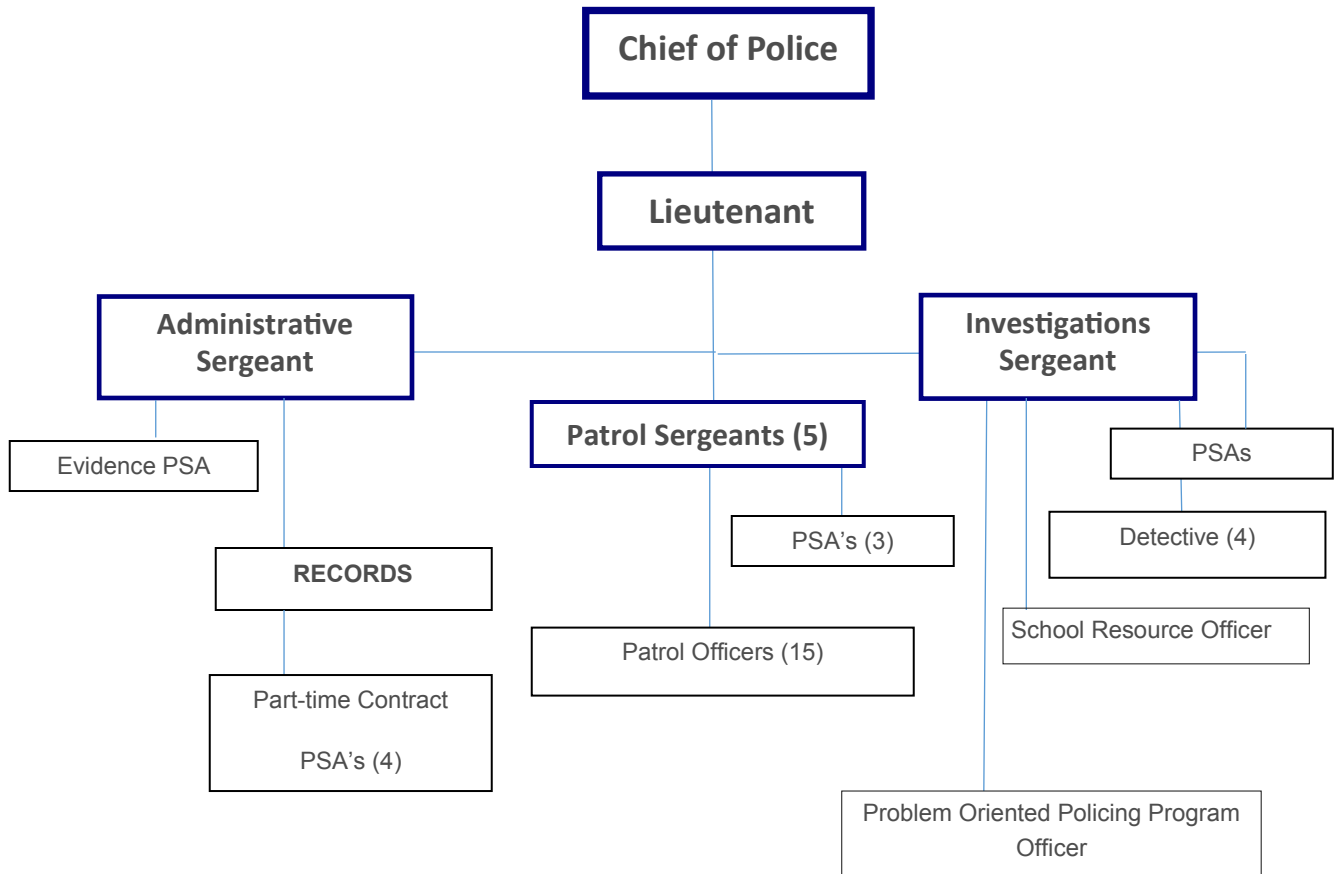

Investigations



Investigations Unit is supervised by Sergeant Robert Roberts

The Investigations Unit is assigned to work regular business hours Monday thru Friday, always being on call during off-duty hours.

The Oakley Police Department Investigations unit is responsible for the investigation of all crimes within the city including investigations forwarded from other agencies. They include murder, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, sex assaults, juvenile crimes, child abuse, missing persons, death cases, burglaries, vehicle thefts, embezzlement, identity theft.

School Resource Officer



Officer C. Minister's duties include:

- Patrol services on and around the high school campus.
- Investigation of crimes occurring on school grounds.
- Liaison between the high school district and the police department.
- Prevention of crime and delinquency on school campus.
- Serve as a resource to students, parents, school staff and police personnel.
- Represent police department at School Attendance Review Board.
- Conduct Diversion Program Hearings in conjunction with REACH Project.
- Assist in solving student problems.
- Help facilitate regular meetings between the school staff and the police where current incidents could be discussed and debriefed.
- Coordinate possible strategies to circumvent or intervene with at risk students or groups.

Patrol



The City of Oakley is divided into three beats. An officer is assigned to each beat and is responsible for providing service to that beat. Patrol Division has five teams plus the traffic unit. Each team is staffed with a Sergeant and three officers. Officers provide many services, to include, dispatched calls for service, traffic enforcement, accidents and routine patrol.

Oakley's K-9 "Koda: is a 7 year old German Shepard who began his career with Oakley On June 14, 2017.

Officer Del Prado worked with Koda at El Cerrito PD. When officer Del Prado transferred to Oakley the city purchased the dog for \$1.00 saving approximately \$40,000. Koda is already cross trained in protection and narcotics.
