SUBJECT: City of Oakley Quarterly Investment Report (4th Quarter FY 2020/21)

### **Background and Analysis**

California law and the City's Investment Policy require the City's fiscal officer to submit a quarterly investment report to the City Council at the end of each quarter. The report should contain information on all securities held, and include a statement denoting the ability of the local agency to meet its expenditure requirements for the next six months.

## **Fiscal Impact**

City resources are organized and accounted for on a fund basis with some of those funds being restricted for specified uses and others that are unrestricted. For investment purposes, however, the funds are invested as a pool. The Investment Report for the Period Ending June 30, 2021 attached shows a combined pool balance of \$78,555,886.03. In addition, the pool had combined 4th Quarter accrued interest earnings of \$52,827.10. Interest for the period continues to reflect the lower rates currently being offered on safe, short-term investments.

The City is in compliance with the adopted investment policy and able to meet its expenditure requirements for the next six months.

## **Staff Recommendation**

Staff recommends the City Council accept the investment report for the 4th Quarter of Fiscal Year 2020/21.
